\$1 per week will provide...

- a one night shelter stay and all basic needs of food and clothing for a family of four
- an adult mentor for a young child
- high quality safety education and training for people to prevent, prepare for and respond to emergencies
- a child with the opportunity to attend summer camp

\$3 per week will provide...

- nine hours of respite care for a senior citizen
- one in-home health care visit by a registered nurse

\$6 per week will provide...

- crisis services to three victims of domestic violence
- two families in need with food, clothing, prescription or utility assistance

\$10 per week will provide...

- seventeen hours of specialized assistance to members of the deaf and hard of hearing community, allowing them to live independently
- five hours of legal service to low-income York County residents and domestic violence survivors

\$15 per week will provide...

- classes to improve the basic literacy skills of one adult learning English as a second language
- six months of low vision exams, evaluations and appropriate low vision aids and appliances and the skills that enable them to lead safe and independent lives

\$20 per week will provide...

- three months of assistance in an early childhood education program for children of low income working families
- adult education, job training and placement services for an economically and socially challenged individual
