

# FALL CYCLE 2025 REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP) TRANSPORTATION INNOVATION GRANTS

United Way of York County recognizes that transportation needs in our community are varied and far-reaching. To make the deepest impact with our grant dollars, and in recognizing the roles that our community partners play in supporting transportation solutions, UWYC is offering the following funding opportunity to support ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) families with transportation limitations:

## **Funding Focus**

We will invest in collaborative transportation initiatives that support and advance the recommendations outlined in the 2024 York County Transportation Study.

Funded projects must address one of the following priority areas, with specific guidance noted for each:

# 1. Strengthening and sustaining carpooling and ride-sharing networks

Projects that expand or improve carpooling networks, particularly in rural communities, will receive special consideration. Initiatives should demonstrate long-term sustainability and a measurable impact on transportation access. We have Interest In Investments In regions 7, 1, and 5 on the map provided In the appendix, but welcome applications for any region In York County.

#### 2. Employer-driven transportation solutions

This category supports projects that improve workforce transportation—such as shuttle services, ride-share programs, or shift coordination. *Employers* should contact Daysha Illarza, Impact Manager, at United Way of York County, to submit an application. # 3. Multi-municipal transportation improvements

Funding will support transportation interventions that require coordination between two or more municipalities, with a focus on regional impact, efficiency, and shared infrastructure improvements. *Municipalities* are eligible to apply under this category and may use awarded funds as matching dollars for the PA Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED) Municipal Assistance Program.

### 4. Transportation strategies that promote economic mobility

Projects should be designed to be scalable and replicable and must clearly demonstrate how the proposed transportation intervention will lead to increased earnings or savings for participants.

# **Eligibility**

- Organizations must be tax-exempt non-profit organization or a tax-exempt government entity.
   Organizations without an eligible status must apply under an eligible fiscal sponsor.
- Organizations must be in existence at least two years upon application submission and be able to demonstrate financial and organizational capacity to implement proposed initiatives.
- Organizations must serve those living in York County.
- Organizations whose mission or projects exclude any group of individuals based on race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy, sexual orientation, or gender identity), national origin, age, or disability will not be considered eligible.

#### Considerations

- Proposals must illustrate measurable impact, and organizations must agree to measure and report on defined outputs if funding is awarded.
- Organizations should demonstrate alignment with UWYC's mission and vision of an equitably thriving York County, as well as financial and organizational capacity to implement proposed solutions.

## **Proposal Review Criteria**

Funding decisions will be based on the following:

- Eligibility for UWYC investment
- The sources and diversity of funding for the organization
- Sound management of resources
- Adequacy of organizational documents
- Financial health
- Mission alignment
- Age-inclusiveness

#### **GRANT REQUEST**

How much funding does your organization request to achieve the selected proposal and anticipated outcomes?

- \*Awards will range from \$25,000 to \$75,000 with the average award expected to be \$50,000
- \*No more than 20% of the requested funding may be allocated to overhead/administrative costs/salaries.
- \*Municipalities applying an age-friendly lens to their work may be eligible for additional funding from Hahn Home Fund for Embracing Aging at the York County Community Foundation.

#### PROPOSAL ENGAGEMENT MEETING

We request that each applicant who meets basic eligibility criteria agree to a 30-minute virtual or in-person meeting for our review committee to gain deeper insight into your program.

#### ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION

Organizations must include the following documentation as part of their application:

- 501c3 IRS Designation, If applicable
- Most recent IRS Form 990, if applicable
- Current Bureau of Charitable Organizations certificate, if applicable
- List of current Board of Directors, including service terms and corporate affiliation, if any
- Most Recently Board Approved Organizational Budget
- Project Budget (template and example provided)
- Budget Narrative (template and example provided)
- Letters of Support from partners or collaborators
- Cost Estimates from vendors, If applicable
- Sample data collection Instruments, If applicable
- Annual audit, independent financial review, or board-approved financial statements, dependent upon organizational revenue size
  - o Audit required for organizations with annual revenues greater than \$750,000
  - o Independent financial review required for organizations with annual revenues between \$400,000-\$749,999
  - Financial Statements with narrative required for organizations with annual revenues under
     \$400,000
